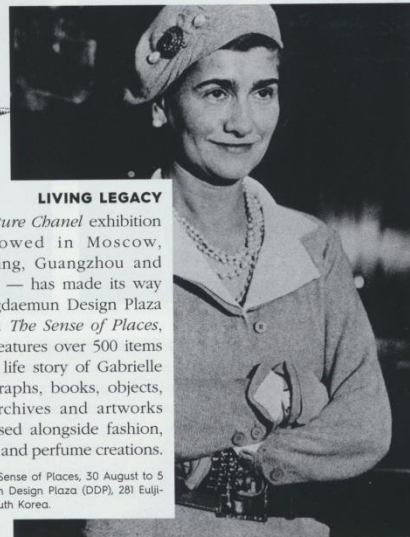

## LIVING LEGACY

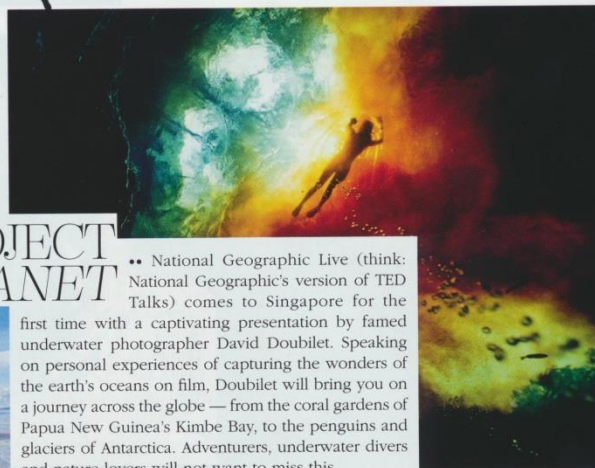
•• Chanel's *Culture Chanel* exhibition — which showed in Moscow, Shanghai, Beijing, Guangzhou and Paris previously — has made its way to Seoul's Dongdaemun Design Plaza (DDP). Entitled *The Sense of Places*, the exhibition features over 500 items that retrace the life story of Gabrielle Chanel. Photographs, books, objects, manuscripts, archives and artworks will be showcased alongside fashion, jewellery, watch and perfume creations.
